Funeral Services To Be Held For Hutch Lee Davis

Funeral rites for Hutch Lee Davis will be conducted from Glenwood Pentecostal Holiness Church this afternoon at 2:30. Burial will be in the family cemetery.

Mr. Davis, 63, died at the Durham, N.C., Veterans Administration Hospital Wednesday night after an illness of five months. Born Jan. 16, 1896, he was the son of Charlie and Martha William Davis. Mr. Davis, a veteran of World War I, had lived in this area most of his life and, until five years ago, worked in the No. 6 Spinning Room of Danville Mills. Married to the former Mary Clay Wells in 1929, they resided in the Mt. Hermon community.

Besides his wife, he is survived by three sons: Larry H. and Carson M. Davis, both of Danville Rt. 2; and David D. Davis, Danville. He also leaves three sisters and two brothers: Mrs. Flora Dixon, Danville; Mrs. Maggie Dixon, Spray, N. C.; Mrs. Mary Nance, Norfolk; Sam and Willie Davis, both of Danville, and one grandchild.

Born Jan. 26, 1896, in Pittsylvania County, she was a daughter of the late William Adison Wells and Lella Ellen Stowe Wells. Most of her life was spent in the Danville area. Prior to her retirement she was employed by Dan River Inc.

On Dec. 7, 1929, she was married to Hutch Lee Davis, who died in April, 1959.
