Mar 12, 1749. Received from Mrs. Mary Neal, widow, administratrix of the late Benjamin Neale, 3 cows and 3 calves, 1 steer, and 2 ewes, due from the estate of sd Benja. Neale. Signed - John Corry.

Page 349. At the request of Jos. Lancaster, the following instrument of writing was recorded on Jun 18, 1749.

I, Edward Diggs of CC, Gentleman, for 50 £ sterling, have sold to Joseph Lancaster of CC, 4 slaves and their increase, called Lewis, a man, Sucky, Cloa, & Sara. If, however, Diggs pays the 50 £ and interest by next May 31, then the above sale is void. Signed Mar 27, 1749 - Edward Diggs. Wit - Jno Lancaster, Rich:^d Holme.

Page 349. At the request of Edmund Porteus, the following deed was recorded on Jun 24, 1749.

Jun 20, 1749 from James Mudd of CC, planter, to Edmund Porteus of CC, for 9000 lbs tobacco and for divers other good causes, a tract of land called St Matthews, lying in CC, bounded by Joseph Nobles line, William Sanders, containing and now laid out for about 205 acres. Signed - James Mudd. Wit - Walter Hanson, Danl of St Thos Jenifer. Mary, the wife of sd James Mudd, released her dower.

Page 351. At the request of Dennis Nicodemus Dowan, the following deed was recorded on Jul 1, 1749.

Apr 12, 1749 from Thomas Greaves (Groves, Graves) of St. Mary's County and George Graves (Groves) of the aforesaid County, to Dennis Nichodemus Dowing of CC, for 11,500 lbs tobacco, a tract of land in CC on the south side of Mattiwoman Cr or Run, called Forna, bounded by the original survey, containing about 80 acres. Signed - Thos Graves, Geo: Graves. Wit - Thos Stone, Walter Hanson.

Page 352. At the request of John Philpott, the following deed of gift was recorded on Jul 5, 1749.

I, Charles Philpott of CC, planter, for the natural love I have for my son, John Philpott, and for divers other causes, I give John, during his natural life, and then to his eldest son and his heirs forever, part of that tract of land

Charles Philpott, s/o Edw and Susanna, was b around 1698. This is based on a statement dated 20 Aug 1753 when he made a deposition stating he was age 55 yrs and Edw Philpott was his father. This deposition further declares: "This Deponent further saith that abt 37 yrs ago, his father Edw Philpott was with him and his Brother, John Philpott, at this white oak when he told them that, that white Oak was a bound tree of his land Philpott and Walkers Run and sd that John Bloo told him so, and this deponent further sd, it was the third bound tree of Walkers Run, this Tree stands in the fork of a fresh Run called Walkers Run." All of this connects Charles Philpott to his parents and his brother John. It also shows his father Edw was speaking of the lands owned earlier by his grandfather Edw Philpott I. This land had been in the family around 94 yrs in 1753. [Liber D 3 folio 152, 153]

All of this connects Charles Philpott to his parents and his brother John. It also shows his father Edw was speaking of the lands owned earlier by his grandfather Edw Philpott I. The Pigg family has long been numerous in Tennessee, and it is not possible to distinguish who is who among many of them. It is very probable that they all descend from 4James Pigg of Patrick County, Virginia. The name of Delilah, wife of 5John Pigg, was used many times by descendants of this couple. Also the name Thomas was used so many times as to make it difficult to differentiate between them. Both 6Thomas H. and 6Joseph Pigg left sons Thomas; therefore, we do not know if 7Thomas Pigg of the seventh generation was the son of 6Thomas H. or 6Joseph Pigg, but he was the son of one or the other.

7Thomas Pigg, the son of either 6Thomas H. or 6Joseph Pigg, was born on January 8, 1845, in the County of Lincoln in Tennessee. He was married in the adjoining County of Giles on February 1, 1871, to Elizabeth Luna, the daughter of John B. Luna. 7Thomas Pigg died on April 28, 1922, and was buried

in Spring Place Cemetery, Spring Place, Marshall County, Tennessee. Elizabeth Luna Pigg was born on May 12, 1850, and died on April 5, 1915. Pigg, who was born on July 14, 1879; 8Thomas Shealey Pigg, who was born on October 8, 1882; 8Odessa L. Pigg, who was born on March 12, 1886; 8Claude M. Pigg, who was born on August 1, 1888. (Information from Mormon Library, Salt Lake City, Utah).

Further search in Tennessee would reveal many more members of the Pigg family in that state. It would be beyond the scope of this work to attempt to name them all.

Robert Adams, by the will of 3Paul Pigg, was left a tract of land of 100 acres. Robert was then living on the tract, and it had probably been given to him upon his marriage to one of 3Paul Pigg's daughters. Which of the girls married Robert Adams is not known, nor do we know to whom the other three daughters married or anything of them.

4Richard Pigg, the son of 3Paul and his second wife Sarah, was probably born in Caroline or Amelia County, Virginia. By the will of his father, he was left the home plantation, which seems to have been located on Great Cherrystone Creek not far from the present county seat town of Chatham. From the list of Tithables for Pittsylvania for 1767, there is listed Mrs. Sarah Pigg and 4Richard Pigg together with negroes: Jim, Luce, Dorcas, Peter, and Phillis, or a total of six tythes, and 500 acres of land. This would indicate that 4Richard was living with his mother Sarah on the home plantation which he was to inherit at her death.

At the September Term of Pittsylvania County Court in 1773, 4Richard Pigg, as plaintiff, sued Joseph Hale, defendant, on a petition, but the suit abated since Joseph Hale was no longer a resident of the county.
