

- 1781, Aug. 15 Letter of Saml. Arnold at Richmond to Col. T. Southall. Mr. Jno. Sale, shoe and boot maker, is desirous of engaging in the public service. He is free from drink and steady in business.
- 1781, Aug. 16 Letter of Baron de Uechbritz [?], Capt., Col. Armand's Legion, at Philadelphia, to [Governor Thomas Nelson]. Col. Towls of the 5th Virginia Regiment informs him that the State of Virginia made him a complement of six hogsheads of tobacco while he was a captive with the enemy and that the same is yet in store for him at Fredericksburg. He asks confirmation of this be directed to him care of Capt. Robert Caldwell near the drawbridge in Philadelphia.
- 1781, Aug. 16 Letter of Cad. Jones, F.Q.M. at Headquarters, Mancock Hill, to Governor Thomas Nelson. When he saw the Governor he was informed that Major Claiborne was given full power to impress wagons for the use of the army. He informs him the Governor has given him no such power. He has sent Capt. Payne, one of his assistants, to wait on the Governor for an order on the Treasury for £50,000.
- 1781, Aug. 18 Letter of Jos. Warley, Capt. Comst. of the P[ennsylvania] Line, to Governor Thomas Nelson. Asks for a warrant to impress two wagons necessary to pursue their march to join Gen. Greene under orders from Lt.Col. Maybane. They have suffered during a long captivity. They are unarmed but wish the pleasure of again serving their country in the field. [Reply is printed in Calendar of Virginia State Papers, v. 2, p. 337.]
- 1781, Aug. 19 Letter of Ant. Wayne at Camp New Castle to Governor Thomas Nelson. His troops want almost every article of provision. They have been in the course of two weeks, six days totally destitute of anything to eat or drink except new Indian corn and water and have neither salt, spirits, bacon or flour, which causes his people to fall sick very fast. He was necessitated to take some corn fields at Bottom's Bridge to prevent the troops from starving, for which the owners received certificates.
