#### TULLOH FAMILY HISTORY

The first ancestor that can be traced is Thomas Tulloh, a surgeon living in Hanover County, Virginia in the 1730's. As of this time, it has not been determined whether he was an emigrant or born here or from what country he may have come. Family tradition says that he came from Scotland.

He married Barbara Garland as indicated in "A History of Louisa County" by Malcolm H. Harris. Tulloh is spelled "Tulloch" which is not unusual. We find it spelled many different ways.

Page 321: "Jane Tulloh, daughter of Thomas and Barbara Garland Tulloh, married Robert Goodwin, December 1, 1766." Robert Goodwin's will is recorded in Louisa County, Virginia. He died May 12, 1789.

There are several references to this first Thomas Tulloh in the Chamberlayne Vestry Book of St. Pauls Parish of Hanover County:

The numbers without pound marks probably refer to pounds of tobacco.

Thomas Tulloh is also mentioned in three early surviving deed books in Hanover County. The rest were destroyed in Richmond where they were taken for safe keeping. The surviving books fell off of the wagon on the way to Richmond from Hanover.

Deed Book 1733 to 1735, page 209:

- 1. Robert Thompson sold 200 acres of land on the South Fork of the Parmunkie River to Thomas Tulloh, Surgeon of Hanover County, for 30 pounds Virginia money on April 3, 1734. The "eight year of the reign of Lord George."
- Thomas Tulloh witnessed deed for 150 acres of land between Lawrence Furgerson and John Ross on March 6, 1734.
- Charles Barrett, Thomas Tulloh, Patrick Henry witnessed deed of Richard Watson to John Henry (Patrick's brother) on June 5, 1735.

Thomas Tulloh was listed as head of family of 9 whites, 12 blacks in Hanover County, Virginia in 1782. (RE: Head of Families, First Census of US - Virginia Heritage Services, Hanover County, Virginia, 1782 - Precinct #5 - List of Thomas Trevillian.)

In addition to Jane already mentioned, Thomas Tulloh had at least one son, David, who is our ancestor and will be discussed later.

Also, possibly are Thomas' children:

- Hugh Tulloh who married Elizabeth Thomas in Petersburg, August 20, 1786.
- Vincent Tulloh, a carpenter of Fredericksville Parish, Louisa County, bought land from Thomas Poindexter on March 25, 1755.
- 3. Elizabeth Tulloh was witness to marriage of Major Zachariah Lewis and Ann Terrill on May 2, 1771.
- 4. Susannah Tulloh, who married Daniel Jones, born April 27, 1766 was probably Thomas' granddaughter.

From the above information, Thomas Tulloh was born about 1710 and lived to about 1790. He was a surgeon and a prominent resident of Hanover County. No earlier record has been found before 1730. Hanover County was formed from New Kent County in 1720. Most of the New Kent County records were also destroyed. No record of Thomas Tulloh was found in the Vestry Book of the Parish from which St. Paul's was formed.

The College of William and Mary does not have records of their early students and could not say whether or not Thomas Tulloh was even a student there. We should check with the colleges in Scotland and England, about 1720, to see if they have any record of Thomas Tulloh. The Scottish Research Society needs so much information to trace a person that if we had that information, it would be all that we need.

David Tulloh was born in Hanover County, Virginia around 1740. He is the only one of the children of Dr. Thomas Tulloh that any significant information has been obtained. He also is the only one that his decendants can be traced.

David, Sr. (the Sr. is used because he had a son named David, Jr.) lived most of his life, if not all, in Hanover County. He deeded 100 acres of land in Hanover County to Robert Whitaker on March 20, 1796. He also deeded land in Hanover County on June 2, 1791, according to the Hanover County records.

David Sr. was on the Hanover County tax list as follows:

1782 - 11 negroes, 5 horses, 35 cattle

1787 - 10 whites, 9 negroes, 5 horses, 12 cattle

1788 - 11 whites, 9 negroes, 5 horses, 11 cattle

He also appeared for several other years.

The census information regarding David, Sr. shows: 1790 - David

Tulloh, Hanover County Census, 9 white males over 16 years, and 12 black males over 16 years. The 1810 Census Hanover County - David Tulloh: 1 male over 45 years old; 2 females between 16 and 26 years old; and 1 female under 10.

The census asked different questions each time and the information thus varied and does not accurately reflect family size or property from year to year.

The 1820 census shows David (Sr.) in Hanover and a David
Tulloh (Jr.) in Louisa. Also shown is a William Tulloh in Albermarle County. We do not have any information on this William Tulloh.

In 1828, (Re: DB35-P 459 Halifax Co. VA. Indenture given by Thomas Tulloh II), David Sr.'s estate in Hanover County was in the hands of David Tulloh, (Jr.) who resided in Louisa County. David (Jr.) was the executor of the estate. So we know then that David (Sr.) died in 1827 or 1828.

David, Sr. had at least 4 children: Susannah, born 1766, married David Jones; David, Jr. born about 1770, died 1831; William born 1765, died 1853; and Thomas (II), born about 1760, died 1844. He must have had more children as reflected in the tax and census information.

Thomas II and William went to Pittsylvania County in the late 1780's. David, Jr. went to Louisa County to start the Louisa Tulloh clan. Phil Tulloh of Taylors, SC has prepared a chart on both the Louisa and Halifax County clans and will be glad to supply anyone interested in one or both charts.

Thomas II served in the Revolutionary War in place of his father David, according to his pension application. Thomas' second wife, Susannah Wilkins, was still receiving a pension as a widow in 1885.

Any family decendants of Thomas II would qualify for the DAR, SAR,

or other Revolutionary War organizations. I have proof of this lineage for anyone wanting it.

Thomas II came to Pittsylvania County about 1790 and lived on Double Creek near the old Kerns Mill and Pond and the old post office at Sutherlin. However, these were not built until well into the 1800's. William Tulloh came, most likely, at the same time and settled on Cain Creek near the Caswell County, NC line. The area is now called Mountain Hill and is near Danville. They lived about ten miles apart.

Thomas married Anne Richardson, daughter of William and Francis Richardson of Pittsylvania County. William Richardson consented, which means that Anne was not of age to consent on her own. The wedding was June 29, 1795. Anne was the mother of all of his children. Anderson Tulloh, on his marriage license, listed Thomas and Annie Tulloh as his parents when he married Jane Carter in 1866.

William Richardson's will probated in Pittsylvania County on August 17, 1818, left his daughter Ann Tulloh f103-1-4, and Thomas Tulloh, his son-in-law, four acres of land; "where his well house now stands."

Thomas and Anne had other children, possibly Edmond, Lucinda and Mary. It is difficult to determine whether these were Thomas' or William's children. Anderson was a witness at Edmond's wedding on June 26, 1828, in Person County, NC to Elizabeth Holt. A lady named Sarah Harrelson, gave 61 acres of land to Edmond (land on Alexander Cunningham's line in Halifax County). Edmond and Elizabeth sold this land to Richard Dillard in 1831. No other information has been found on Edmond. Many people were moving to Kentucky and other states to the west and south at that time. Perhaps, some of the Tullohs in Texas or other states may be Edmond's decendants.

Lucinda Tulloh married Leonard Richardson on January 5, 1836.

Lucinda was old enough to sign for herself. They were married by the well known Baptist minister, Thomas E. Jeter. According to the 1850 Halifax Census, Leonard, a Planter, and Lucinda, both 45 years of age, had Ann age 13, William age 12, and Thomas J. age 7. Mary Toller, age 45, lived with them. Mary was possibly Lucinda's sister. A Mary Tulloh, age 35, lived with Anderson Tulloh also, according to the 1850 Halifax County Census. It seems likely that both Thomas and William had daughters named Mary.

William Tulloh married Mary Price on March 5, 1800 in Caswell County. He gave his daughter, Betsy Price Tulloh, one negro woman on March 6, 1809 as recorded in Deed Book 16, page 310 of Pittsylvania County.

William and his wife Polly (must be Mary Price) were involved in numerous Pittsylvania court actions until about 1834 - over the estate settlement of a Nathaniel Thomas, a William Fleming who owed William money, and other matters.

William, on April 27, 1807, bought 60 acres of land on both sides of Cain Creek from John Epperson and his wife Sarah for f60 VA money. Both William and Thomas II knew the Eppersons from Hanover County. This land was "on both sides of Cain Creek near the Carolinas on Danville Rd." It was interesting to see what else was included in this sale. It would be worth a small fortune today. Also included were two feather beds, one folding table, one square dressing table, two black walnut bedstands, one black walnut chest, one sorrel horse called Jack, one blaze faced cow and yearling, one loom, one Dutch oven, one grind stone, one iron kow, one pair flat irons, three killing hogs, one grind stone, one large bell metal skillet, two poll axes, and also all of the crop of corn, wheat and

tobacco.

On July 17, 1800, William bought for f7 VA money 30 acres of land on the waters of Cain Creek. His property line description began at Holaways Spring.

William later moved to Milton which was near Cain Creek but across the Dan River. He owned land on Kersey's Branch which flows into Country Line Creek near Milton. His land and home were located on the north side of present NC 57 and just north of the Woodside Inn and adjoining Connelly's Methodist Church. His grave may be one of the unmarked at the church. The old building was called Connelly's Meeting House which later became a church.

William Tulloh's will, made in 1846, is recorded in Caswell County. Although he was married at least once and maybe three times and had children, he left his property to Millie and Mary Horton and to a Mrs. Mildred Horton. I have found no record of his wife or children as to whether they were living at the time of his death. He was 88 or 89 years old when he died in 1853 or 1854. He was living with the Hortons or they were living in his house when he died. Apparently, they took care of him during his old age.

In 1796, "20th year of our Independence", William Tulloh bought in Person County, NC 100 acres of land for 100 pounds from Joseph Beadles. In 1798, he sold this land to Thomas Jones Chambers for 100 pounds. This land bordered the lands of Byrd Walls, William Stanfield, William Sachs, and Joseph Biedler.

On February 10, 1839, William sold to Caleb H. Richmond for \$20.00, two acres of land which Richmond "had caused to be flooded by creation of his mill pond" on Mill Creek. Mill Creek was probably the same stream as Kersey's Branch.

In 1819 and 1821, William was a guest at Red House Tavern at

Semora, NC.

In 1841, William made an affidavit regarding his brother Thomas Tulloh's military service in the Revolutionary War. On June 16, 1806, he witnessed a deed given by his brother Thomas Tulloh. If anyone was interested in finding out more about William Tulloh, they could read the court actions in Pittsylvania County and his deeds given and purchased in Pittsylvania, Caswell, and Person Counties.

Thomas Tulloh II came to Pittsylvania County in the early 1790's. He bought land in Halifax County on Double Creek on the Pittsylvania line in 1792, was married in 1795, bought property from an estate sale of a Jeremiah Warren in Person County in 1797, and bought more land on Double Creek in Pittsylvania County in 1801. An earlier deed in Caswell County, of land bought by a Thomas Tulloh, is recorded but may not be our ancestor.

On January 21, 1839, Thomas married Susannah Wilkins and according to his pension application, moved to Person County, NC about this time. Susannah was living and still receiving her pension in 1885. Thomas died in 1844 probably about 84 years old.

Anderson Tulloh, son of Thomas Tulloh II, was born about 1803 as was listed to be 47 years old in the 1850 Census of Halifax County. He married Eliza Fielding about 1830. Eliza was called Louise in an 1844 deed. She was the mother of all of Anderson's children.

The 1850 Census showed Anderson and his family as follows:

Anderson Tulloh (age 47, a planter, estate value of \$1,000).

Eliza 38, Newton 10, Louisana 8, Mary 6, Noah 5 and Mary 35 (probably Anderson's sister).

The 1850 Census also shows the family of Fielding Link age 35, planter, estate of \$800, Elizabeth 33, Henry 6, Mary 4, and William 1. No one knew then in 1850 that Noah Tulloh, age 5, would later marry

Mary Jane Link, age 4, and have a large family.

I have not been able to find the marriage bond of Anderson Tulloh and Eliza Fielding as of this time. It may be significant that Eliza's last name was Fielding and Mary Jane's father was also named Fielding.

Anderson's son Newton may have been killed in the Civil War or possibly he went south or west as many people did at that time.

Louisana married William Blackwell, and Mary married Sandy Boyd.

There is no record as to what happened to Mary Tulloh, age 35, in 1850.

Eliza died about 1860 leaving Anderson a widower. On June 25, 1866, Anderson, age 60, married Jane Carter, age 45, in Halifax County. Both were born and lived in Halifax County. His parents were listed as Thomas and Annie Tulloh. Her parents were listed as Thomas and Betsy Carter. His occupation was farmer.

Jane was a widow of William J. Carter who was killed in the Civil War. William Carter had written a war-time will naming Jane as his only heir. Apparently a Richard Carter, the father or brother of William Carter, claimed William Carter's estate after he was killed. Anderson, on behalf of his wife Jane, in 1866, brought suit against Richard Carter and won. He was appointed administrator of the estate of William J. Carter, and settled the estate.

On October 27, 1874, Halifax County Deed Book 64 - page 67, a deed was recorded giving Anderson Tulloh possession of 190 acres of land and all personal property on Lawson's Creek from the estate of William J. Carter. Anderson paid \$80.00 to William A. Blackwell for one legatees share and \$265.00 to A. H. Richardson for five legatees share.

This land from William J. Carter's estate was located on Lawson's Creek. The land was bordered on the north by N. Watkins land, on the west by the road from Mt. Carmel to Cunningham's store, on the South by the land of the estate of Elam Bass, and on the East by the land of Anderson Tulloh.

Anderson bought land in Halifax County as follows:

1840 - 131 acres on Lawson Creek from William Warren

1855 - 118 acres on Lawson Creek from George Carter

1874 - 190 acres on Lawson Creek from Wm. J. Carter's estate.

His wife, Jane's inheritance from her first husband.

Anderson and Jane sold 24 5/8 acres of land on the Milton Road to Noah Tulloh for 150.00 on May 24, 1875. Other land we sold as follows:

1845 - 20 acres on Lawson Creek to John Dillard.

1883 - 9.1 acres to W. J. Wilkins.

1889 - 150 acres to Noah Tulloh from his estate.

1889 - 107 1/2 acres to Louisana Blackwell from his estate.

Anderson Tulloh's Will recorded in Halifax lists Jane, his wife as his heir. Noah is listed as Executor and Beneficiary. Also listed as heirs are his daughters, Mary Ann Boyd and Louisana Blackwell. No mention is made of Newton. Any differences in the land bought and sold and transferred to his children are due most likely to inaccuracy of the records or trying to interpret the records.

Anderson is listed in the Olive Branch Methodist Church History as having given logs for building of the church. His son Noah was on the Building Committee.

Noah Harrison Tulloh married Mary Jane Link on December 16, 1868 in the home of Mary Jane's parents, Fielding and Elizabeth Link near Alton in Halifax County, Virginia. They had eleven children - 5 boys - Newton Anderson, William Fielding, James Harrison, John Southall, and Edward Lewis and 6 girls - Sallie Elizabeth, Mary Eliza, Katherine Palmer, Lucy Jane, Mattie Lou, and Annie Lee. Family sheets follow for each of the children and any additional sheets any family member wishes to provide.
