THOMAS CARTER

Goochland County

Thomas Carter, b. est. ca 1680; d. by 21 Jun 1738 Henrico Co.; said to have m/1 ____; m/2 **Penele Carrell**, d/o Roger Carrell of Henrico Co.; the will of Roger Carrell was recorded 4 Mar 1737 in which one of the executors is "my son Thomas Carter" (HCWV-1 p. 166); he may have been the Thomas transported to the colonies by Abraham Michaux; Feb Ct. 1722 he purchased land from Tarlton Woodson (HCVD-2 p. 198) & in 1728 he wit. a deed in Goochland (GCWD-1 p. 2) and in 1736 Thomas wit. a will in Henrico Co. (HCWV-1 p. 210); children from his will:

27 Jan 1713; Abraham Michaux claimed 850 ac. Henrico Co. on s. side of the James River for transport of several persons including Thomas Carter (LOP 10.123)

3 Dec 1733; Thomas Carter patented 400 ac. on s. side of the James River on a branch of *Muddy Creek* by the name of *Deep Run* (LOP 15.133)

10 Jun 1735; from Thomas Carter of Goochland Co. to son Edward Carter; *Licking Hole Survey on Beaver Dam Creek*, being part of land I bought of Tarlton Woodson, ex. of his father John Woodson, dec'd. If Edward die, then land to revert to my son Stephen (GCWD-1 p. 72)

10 Jun 1735; 17 Jun 1735; from Thomas Carter to John Cressey, both of Goochland Co.; for £12; 200 ac. on s. side of James River next to *Deep Creek* near *Muddy Creek*; /s/ Thomas Carter, Susannah Carter (GCWD-1 p. 73)

8 Sep 1736; Thomas Carter pat. 400 ac. on *Turkey Cock Creek* (LOP 17.165)

Will of Thomas Carter of St. James Parish, Henrico Co.; 2 Nov 1726; 21 Jun 1738

To eldest son Robert & 2nd son Thomas, each 1 yearling cow

To sons John & Edward, 1s each

To son Joseph, all land I live on, 100 ac.; if he dies to son Edward

1. **Robert Carter**; he poss. was the Robert who died by 28 May 1759 leaving a will in Cumberland Co. (CuWB 1.183); m. **Mary** ____; in 1728 he was living on the south side of the James River in the area of *Muddy Creek* & *Willises Creek* (GCWD-1 p. 8); he is said to have operated *Carter's Ferry*; he was probably the "Robed Carter" who appr. an estate in Goochland in 1746 (GCWD-3 p. 18)

____ 1729; 18 Nov 1729; from Robert Carter to Susannah Hulsey, widow, both of St. James Parish, Goochland Co.; for £30; 100 ac. on n. side of James River between land of Henry Atkinson & Jno. Webb; where Charles Hulsey did live; Mary, w/o Carter, relinquished her dower rights (GCWD-1 p. 16)

17 Apr 1736; 20 Apr 1736; deed from Tarlton Woodson giving acreage he sold from the *Licking Hole Survey* which includes 200 ac. sold Robert Carter and 100 ac. sold Thomas Carter (GCWD-1 p. 84)

20 Mar 1738; 20 Mar 1738; from Robert Carter to Stephen Hughes, both of Goochland Co.; for £60; 100 ac. on n. side of James River, bounded by Thomas Carter, dec'd; Mary, w/o Carter relinquished dower rights (GCWD-2 p. 26)

2. **Thomas Carter, Jr.**; d. 1763 Goochland Co.; m. ca 1751 Goochland Co. **Mary Kilpatrick** (DR); d/o Alexander Kilpatrick & Elizabeth Easley (widow of Philip Martin); Thomas Carter Jr. & Sr. held land in Henrico Parish in 1739 (VBHP); Mary was in Goochland in 1773 when she and son Baynes sold the family plantation in Goochland; children:

GILES CARTER

Henrico County

The first Giles Carter who came to Virginia on the ship *Supply*, which sailed from Bristol 24 Sep 1620, was of Gloucestershire, England. He arrived at Berkeley Hundred 29 Jan 1620/1 and returned to England just before or after the Indian massacre of Friday, 1 Apr 1622.

The next Giles Carter to arrive in Virginia is believed to have also been from Gloucestershire and to have sailed from Bristol. On 7 Apr 1653 a Mr. William Fry was granted a patent for land near the head of *Chickahominy River* for transport of 15 persons including a Giles Carter (PB 3.192). The next mention of a Giles Carter places him on the plantation of Col. James Crewe.

Col. Crewe was in Virginia when he witnessed a receipt on 14 Apr 1656 and was recognized in court on 25 Jun 1656. He is known to have returned to England as an undated deposition shows Lt. Col. Thomas Grendon loaned Crewe a rapier "once when he was going to England."

Col. Crewe was court-martialed at *Green Spring* [home of Sir William Berkeley] 24 Jan 1676/7 and sentenced to be hanged for his participation in Bacon's Rebellion. His estate was left to a nephew back in England with generous gifts to Giles Carter and his family including the right to live on and manage the Crewe estate for life.

Will of James Crewe, planter of Turkey Island; 23 Jul 1676; 10 Xber 1677

To Mary Carter, d/o Giles Carter, 10,000# tobacco, feather bed, 2 blankets, rugg, to be paid 3 yrs. after my decease with interest to be toward her clothing
To Susan Carter, same as her sister Mary
To my man Tero, freedom at 3 years after my decease, with cow & sow, if I have any left, and as much land as he can tend for life
To Hannah Carter, w/o Giles Carter, negro maid Keate and her increase
To Daniel Price, my best suite & coate I have
To Giles Carter, what he owes me and the plantation which I have formerly let him; he & his wife Hannah to have it during both their lives rent free, only paying one grain of Indian Corn when demanded
To said Giles Carter's children, if either should die, then it should come to the rest
If Hannah Carter should die, the said negro to Theodrick Carter her son, and if she has other children, them to be at her disposing
To Cozen Mr. Mathew Crews my sole ex. of all my lands in Virginia or elsewhere and remainder of my estate
My loving friend Giles Carter to live in my sd. house, command my servants & make crops or any other things as shall be convenient & necessary for sd. plantation and give acct. yearly as my sd. Executor shall order

Although some family histories state that Hannah, the wife of Giles Carter of *Turkey Island*, was Hannah Crewe, circumstantial evidence suggests this is not correct as Col. Crewe left his estate to an English relative and his will calls Giles Carter "friend."

Giles Carter, Sr., b. ca 1634, age 46 on 1 Jun 1560 (HCVD-1 p. 148); d. by 2 Feb 1701 Henrico Co.; m. **Hannah** ____; the 1662 will of John Rowen left Giles a cow & house & land on his plantation for 1 year (HCVW-1 p. 219); in the tax list of *Turkey Island* on 2 Jun 1679 Giles was charged with 6 tithables; children from his will:

25 Feb 1684/5; 1 Apr 1684; from Giles Carter & Hannah his wife to William Randolph, Gent., all of Varina Parish, Henrico Co.; for £20; 50 ac. given them by will of James Crews, dec'd; dated 23 Jul 1676; being part of Crews' land at *Turkey Island* (HCVD-1 p. 27)

28 Feb 1684; 15 Apr 1685; from William Cocke to Giles Carter, planter, both of Henrico Co. & Parish; for £25; 59 ac. on *Turkey Island Mill Run* (HCVD-1 p. 28)

1 Feb 1686; Court at Varina; Giles Carter granted certificate for 800 ac. due for importation of 16 people (HCVD-1 p. 140)

21 Oct 1687; Robert Woodson, Richard Ferris, Giles Carter, William Ferris & Roger Cumins granted 1,780 ac. (LOP 7.601) in Parish of Varina at *White Oak Swamp* on the n. side of the James; patented issued Oct 1688; by then Cumins had died and William Ferris had not paid his portion of the charges; thus Giles Carter's share was 552 ac. next to swamp where John Watson lives (HCVD-1 p. 57); 100 years later John Carter, grandson of Giles, gave a piece of land at *White Oak Swamp* to his son John Carter, Jr.

- 1138-6 **Samuel Jefferson Carter**, b. 3 Jan 1803 Halifax Co.; d. 31 Mar 1873 *Carter's Landing* on the Mississippi River, West TN; m/1 **Eliza Staggs**, b. 10 Dec 1810; d. 7 Jan 1875 (3 children); m/2 **Anne Vaulx** (had 14 children including the author, William Giles Harding Carter); lived in Davidson Co, TN during the Civil War
