

## REYNOLDS

1. WILLIAM<sup>1</sup> REYNOLDS was of Providence in 1637, where 20 Aug. 1637, or a little later, he and twelve others signed the following compact: "We whose names are hereunder, desirous to inhabit in the town of Providence, do promise to subject ourselves in active and passive obedience to all such orders or agreements as shall be made for public good of the body in an orderly way, by the major consent of the present inhabitants; masters of families, incorporated together in Town fellowship, and others whom they shall admit unto them only in civil things." 27 July 1640, he and 38 others signed an agreement for a form of government. 30 Jan. 1644, he and others of Providence testified as to the outrage on Warwick settlers by Massachusetts. Under date of 27 April 1646, he sold land. Name of his wife is not given. He had 1 child.

2. JAMES<sup>2</sup> REYNOLDS (*William*<sup>1</sup>) on 13 May 1665 petitioned the Assembly for accommodation of land. He took oath of allegiance 30 May 1671, and the same year was Constable; was overseer of the Poor in 1687, a Conservator of the Peace in 1690; and he died about 1700. He had a wife Deborah. 3. FRANCIS<sup>3</sup> REYNOLDS (*James*,<sup>2</sup> *William*<sup>1</sup>) was born 12 Oct. 1662 at North Kingston, R. I., and died there 1722. He married Elizabeth Greene, born 17 Oct. 1668, daughter of Elizabeth (Anthony) and James Greene (see GREENE). His will was probated 14 April 1722 and names the following children:

4. PETER<sup>4</sup> REYNOLDS (*Francis*,<sup>3</sup> *James*,<sup>2</sup> *William*<sup>1</sup>) born in North Kingston, R. I., about 1691, died there March 1769. He married Sarah —. He was willed one-half the "Sand Hill" homestead by his father, Francis Reynolds.

5. JAMES<sup>4</sup> REYNOLDS (*Francis*,<sup>3</sup> *James*,<sup>2</sup> *William*<sup>1</sup>) was born at "Sand Hill" about 1693. He married Hannah Jenkins.

6. JOHN<sup>5</sup> REYNOLDS (*Peter*,<sup>4</sup> *Francis*,<sup>3</sup> *James*,<sup>2</sup> *William*<sup>1</sup>) was born at North Kingston, R. I., about 1721 and died there 4 Oct. 1804. He married, first, Phoebe Tillinghast and, second, Anne Utter, born 28 Oct. 1725, died 25 April 1782, daughter of Anne (Stone) and William Utter.

7. DANIEL<sup>6</sup> REYNOLDS (*John,<sup>5</sup> Peter,<sup>4</sup> Francis,<sup>3</sup> James,<sup>2</sup> William<sup>1</sup>*) was born at North Kingston, R. I., 25 June 1760, and died in Jefferson County, New York, 16 Jan. 1816. He married his second cousin, Waite Reynolds, born 25 Dec. 1759, died 1794, daughter of Mehitable (Jenkins) and John Reynolds (see No. 5, this chapter). He moved to Shaftsbury, Vt., in 1788 and purchased 60 acres of land. Soon afterwards he moved to Oneida County, N. Y., and bought a farm in the famous Mohawk Valley, about five miles above Rome, where he resided until 1810, when he then moved to Jefferson County, N. Y., and bought a farm near Richmond and resided there until his death.

8. AMOS<sup>7</sup> REYNOLDS (*Daniel,<sup>6</sup> John,<sup>5</sup> Peter,<sup>4</sup> Francis,<sup>3</sup> James,<sup>2</sup> William<sup>1</sup>*) was born in Shaftsbury, Vt., 17 April 1786, and died at Maumee City, Ohio, 12 Sept. 1868. He married, 20 March 1808 at Winfield, Herkimer County, N. Y., Laura Kellogg, born in Hartford, Conn., 11 Dec. 1786, died in Maumee City, Ohio, 27 Sept. 1853, daughter of Lucy (Seymour) and Captain Martin Kellogg (see KELLOGG).

Soon after his marriage, he moved from his father's farm in the Mohawk Valley to Rodman, Jefferson County, where he resided until 1824, then moved to Clayton in same county. He was a successful farmer, but became blind about 1840, when he retired from farming and sold his farm to his son Charles. He moved to Maumee City, Ohio, in 1852, where he resided until his death.

9. GEORGE W.<sup>8</sup> REYNOLDS (*Amos*,<sup>7</sup> *Daniel*,<sup>6</sup> *John*,<sup>5</sup> *Peter*,<sup>4</sup> *Francis*,<sup>3</sup> *James*,<sup>2</sup> *William*<sup>1</sup>) was born 2 February 1809 on his grandfather's, Daniel Reynold's, farm in the Mohawk Valley, Oneida County, N. Y., and died 22 Oct. 1833. He married Laura Lucy Page, born 20 Dec. 1814, died 29 Dec. 1864, daughter of Sallie (Stephens) and Amos B. Page of Rutland, Vt. Mr. Reynolds married second time, 11 April 1866, Mrs. Ann P. Gregory, formerly Miss Ann P. Clark, born in Greenfield, Mass., 15 Aug. 1820.

In 1834, he moved to Rocky Springs, Miss., and lived there until 1841, when he moved to Maumee City, Ohio.

Mr. Reynolds became a member of the City Council of Maumee, was County Commissioner for three years, and was later elected Mayor of Maumee. He again moved south in 1876 and entered the real estate business in Houston, Texas, where he was residing when he wrote a sketch of his life in 1897 at the age of eighty-eight years.
