Benjamin Reynolds' son, Jacob, was the father of Jacob Reynolds' Jr., the grandfather of Barclay. Taylor Reynolds, the father of Barclay, was born in the Sixth district of this county, and was married to Miss Eliza Taylor. They were parents of eight children, namely; Ann T., who married Jacob Kirk, of Rising sun; Barclay, Charles, Henrietta, Jacob, who are all deceased; John T., of Virginia; Hetty.
